Neville Sweijd studied at Rhodes University and the University of Cape Town where he completed his PhD in Marine Sciences.

He has held the posts of senior researcher in Fisheries at the University of Cape Town, whereafter he managed the International Ocean Institute – SA branch, hosted by the University of the Western Cape. From 2002-2007 Dr Sweijd held the post of Director of the Benguela Environment Fisheries Interaction and Training Programme (BENEFIT), an inter-governmental marine science programme among the governments of Angola, Namibia and South Africa, based in Swakopmund, Namibia.

Dr Sweijd served as a specialist in the Abalone Working Group (M&CM), Secretary of the International Abalone Society, and Deputy President of the Aquaculture Association of Southern Africa. He is currently serving on the IOC Global Ocean Observing System (GOOS) Panel for Integrated Ocean Observation (PICO) and is a National Forum Representative on the Southern African Network for Coastal and Oceanographic Research (SANCOR).

Dr Sweijd is currently the Manager of the Coasts and Oceans Competence Area at the Council for Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR). He is a member of a range of panels and committees on coastal and marine science matters and is serving as interim manager of the African Centre for Climate and Earth System Science.
